

“Healing Your Religious Past”

“Healing, holding, and letting go: Dealing with your religious past.”

In this class we will look at your religious past and offer tools for you to sort through the following:

- 1) what things you were taught by prior religions that you value and still have meaning for you;
- 2) what things have harmed you and you need to heal from;
- 3) what things have held you back from your spiritual potential that you can let go.

We will address the binary (good/bad) thinking that causes so much harm and look at ways we can safely salvage what is good from our religious past without succumbing to any theology that is harmful or hateful in the process.

“How to” directions will be printed for these various tasks and a sign-up sheet for each category will be available.


Christmas Caroling




The January meeting will be on Thursday, December 7th at 11:30 a.m. at Bluff City Grill, 424 E. Broadway, Alton IL.
