have it before the increasing heat forces me inside for most of the year. It is a wonderful time to get out and about and as you do, I encourage you to look around for ways you can connect with others here in our church community.

We have so many things happening it is hard to even know where to start, but this month <u>I want to</u> <u>lift up two things</u>, the new class coming up at the end of the month on **Creating Your Own Theology** and the need for **Set Up and Break Down teams**.

First, if you are approached to help set up or break down the worship space, and you can physically do so, please say yes! We need everyone to take a few weeks here and there to keep services moving smoothly. This is the biggest task we have right now because without it we can't do church. We have to get all the A/V equipment and seats in place before worship, and then we have to put everything back for the Masons to use the space later in the week. This is our part of the bargain for the INCREDIBLE deal they gave us on the rent, so please do help out as you are physically able. Signups will be going around church soon. If you cannot help physically, but you might be able to help us coordinate, that is also really useful, so stop a Board member or myself and we can get you connected that way too.

The Create Your Own Theology class is on zoom, it's Mondays March 18 & 25 from 6-7:30 p.m., and it's a great way to invite people to check us out because this is about people exploring their own spirituality, not about me telling anyone what to believe. So, if you have a friend, colleague or family member, a neighbor or co-worker that has ever shown an interest in thinking about spiritual things and who isn't a hard line fundamentalist, give them the invite and say you would love to see them there! There is no fee for the class, no prereading required and nothing you need to know ahead of time, it is all part of the class. I have taught this to groups of Pagans, UUs, Atheists and liberal Christians and so far it has always been well received, so I am excited to offer it again here and I hope it can be a good evangelism tool for us! After our embezzlement, things looked bleak when the Board resigned en masse and our minister left. With the help of our amazing Board, we were able to keep us moving forward (reminds me of the song from Emma's Revolution) and we came out of the pandemic more financially stable than we were when it began. I am also proud we have kept our congregants safe from the pandemic. Some might complain we have been perhaps too cautious, but I

believe there is no social justice when people don't feel safe coming to church. We have worked hard to accommodate all and keeping everyone safe and sound through a precarious time!

I will reiterate again, how grateful I am for all of you who have continued to step up and support our church! We changed our name to reflect our status as a CONGREGATION, not as just a building...a church. Dee Evans shared her perspective on this several months ago and that message really stuck with me. We are the people, not the building.

And speaking of buildings, Alex has asked me to take on the responsibility of finding us a new permanent home and I will begin work on that later this spring, although I have been sniffing around here and there to try to think more creatively about options for us!

It seems the groundhog was right and spring is upon us...relax...enjoy...get outside and breathe deeply! It's a beautiful world, even if it feels a bit chaotic at times!


REMINDER

Official Legal Name Change

On September 24, 2023 the members of the <u>First</u> <u>Unitarian Church of Alton</u> approved a change of name to <u>Metro East Unitarian Universalist</u> <u>Congregation</u>. This name change became official on February 1, 2024 and an "Amended Affidavit of Incorporation" was recorded by the Madison County Recorder of Deeds. The original incorporation document was signed on July 1, 1949.

Hello everyone! Our little RE program is growing all the time! We are focused this month on justice as a theme. We will be defining justice, talking about the difference between justice and fairness, and exploring the ways justice relates to democracy and the democratic process. Join us for a time of relaxation, rejuvenation, and illuminating workshops to feed the mind, body, and spirit.


