WELCOME EDEN JOHNSON!

I hope this newsletter finds you well and

enjoying the holidays with loved ones. If you look around the church you will see that things are

jumping! We have lots of folks coming as visitors and joining as new members, and between this fantastic growth and some extra health challenges on my end, the Board has decided to hire someone to assist with all the in-person events and groups we have going on (and the even more we will have once we get a building of our own!)

This is an exciting time in the life of our church, and I hope that you will join me in welcoming Eden Johnson as he/they gets adjusted to this role and we all work to integrate new folks into our church. I'm going to answer a few quick questions here, but you can always email me other questions and we will have more time for discussion at the mid-year meeting as well.

- Why are we hiring a new person? So we can have an in-person staff member for events, pastoral care, etc., given Claudia's disabilities.
- **Is Eden a minister?** They are working on it. They have finished seminary and are going through the process, but as you may remember from Rev. Dee and Rev. Sabrina, it can take years! So for now, Claudia is the minister and Eden is their assistant, together they are a team providing ministry to MEUUC.
- If Claudia has such health problems, why didn't we just hire a different minister? There is a shortage of ministers in the UUA right now, since a lot of them retired during the pandemic. As a result, most will not move for less than a full time position, leaving us to look for alternatives as we can't afford full time yet. Also, the Board really wanted the continuity of having a minister who has been with us in one way or another since 2020 stay with us through getting land, building a building, and moving. Once we are settled in the new building, we will all reassess the situation and decide as a congregation what our ministry needs are and what will best serve us moving forward.
- How much is this going to cost us? At the moment, nothing extra. A generous donor is covering the difference in salary for at least this fiscal year.
- So when I have a problem, who do I call? Either of us! As a ministry team we work together to make sure that your needs are being met, and that includes making sure that your communications get routed to whoever is doing

the thing. In fact, we will shortly have team emails, so you just send one email and get all of us! So stay tuned for that.

I leave you with this blessing: May 2025 bring us closer together as a community filled with love, hope, and justice. May the fire of our faith warm us in cold times, and may we share that warmth with all who need it, even as we ourselves adapt to change here in our community and in the larger world.
