Rev. Claudia's Letter

Hello everyone! As I write this, we just had our mid-year meeting, and the major focus for us for the next 6 months (and beyond) is how we

can be a welcoming sanctuary to folks who are threatened by the current administration.

As a church we are guided by love and justice, and our church has specialized in issues of disability and queer inclusion and justice, which are guiding our decisions about buildings and moving.

This doesn't mean, though, that we don't support other needs! In this newsletter you will find information about the local overnight warming center and hot meals being provided to those who are unhoused in our community, an invitation to a reproductive justice book study, and more.

As I said last Sunday, we might not have the power to change what is happening in Washington, but we DO have the power to change things in our sphere of influence. If you are someone in danger because of this administration, then being here at church, in a community that loves and supports you, where you can be your authentic self IS real resistance. Being happy and cared for by people who love you IS resistance. Thriving despite everything they are trying to do to us IS resistance. Lots of times folks forget that joy can be a profound resistance.

And for anyone who has extra capacity, check out the things that www.UUANI.org is doing. They work on everything from voting rights to climate actions, all from the perspective of our UU values.

Finally, MEUUC needs land- quickly! While we are so very grateful to the Masonic Brothers for allowing us to be in their space, anyone who was there Sunday and had to stand to eat at the potluck because we ran out of chairs can attest that we are officially out of space. What a great problem to have!

As a church we can go anywhere in the area so let's look in residential areas as well as commercial space. We need 2+ acres, (emphasis on the +), and the cheaper the better. We have \$200,000 to buy land with, but the less we spend on land the more we can spend on the building before having to take out a mortgage or the like (no final decision on building financing has been made, but whatever is done it'll be better if we have more cash available).

These are terrifying and thrilling times, all jumbled together. Lean on each other and when you find someone else as scared and stressed and vulnerable as you are, invite them in because we're better together than apart. We need each other today and in the years to come. May love lead our way forward always. Amen and blessed be.

Jessie Dominick will have surgery on Friday, 1/31.


